



Women in the Mechanical Industry Scholarship

MCAA/MSCA's Women in the Mechanical Industry has established a scholarship to recognize high-achieving female students working towards a degree relative to the mechanical industry. One of the goals of Women in the Mechanical Industry is to help mentor female students interested in a career in our industry and make sure they understand the opportunities available to them.

The \$5,000 scholarship will be presented to a worthy student(s), nominated by a faculty advisor of a chartered MCAA student chapter, who will be selected by the Women in the Mechanical Industry Steering Committee based on the criteria presented below.

The scholarship winner(s) will be announced at the Awards of Excellence Breakfast, which takes place during the annual MCAA convention on Wednesday, March 28th. **The winning nominee must be present at the ceremony to accept the award.**

Criteria

The nominee is:

1. A female student who is either a junior in a four-year program or a senior in a five-year program.
2. Majoring in construction management, mechanical engineering, architectural engineering or a discipline related to mechanical construction, mechanical service or plumbing contracting.
3. Has demonstrated exceptional scholastic achievement.
4. Has demonstrated leadership skills (i.e., either as an MCAA student chapter officer, leader of the MCAA student chapter competition team, fund-raising project, community service project, membership recruiting drive, etc.).
5. Has demonstrated interest in developing a career in the mechanical, mechanical service, or plumbing industry by working part-time or as an intern for an MCAA/MSCA member for at least one summer or one term, whichever applies.
6. Has otherwise demonstrated characteristics or achievements that distinguish her as a nominee worthy of this scholarship.
