PHELPS BARRY & ASSOCIATES HIRED AS NEW LOBBYING REPRESENTATIVES

MCA of Chicago recently hired the firm Phelps Barry & Associates to be our representatives in Springfield. We're excited to begin working with them and have already had our first bill review, which went as expected.

More than 4.000 bills have been introduced this year, and this first meeting with them not only gives us a baseline of bills to watch, but also helps Phelps Barry better understand our concerns going forward. If anyone needs a pre-apprentice waiver for a state project, Phelps Barry will intervene directly for them.

The bills we're currently watching pertain to the following topics: energy, bidding laws, workers' compensation, design-build, Illinois pre-apprentice requirements, prevailing wage, wage requirements, labor, liens, zoning and more. We decided to "slip" for a couple of bills, and did not slip against any at this time.

Phelps Barry also has resources in Chicago to help us keep our ear to the ground there. Both Springfield and Chicago have been very active lately and it's important that we keep up with the latest developments. Hats off to our government affairs members who put in a lot of time on this.

We also participate in IMSCA, which includes almost 30 construction groups that get together on issues that affect the construction industry. Most of the time they align with our own concerns. Frontline is our new firm running IMSCA, and Ryan Roth is the new executive director. IMSCA is using a new video update where Ryan talks about what's going on in a TV news-like format. MCA members gathered at Ditka's in Oakbrook Terrace for our regular meeting on April 9.


